EVERGREENS

American Arborvitae ○ ◐ ❖ ☑ S 25-40'

REMARKS: Hardy in zones 3-8. Often used as accent tree or privacy hedge. Bright green leaves on top, pale green on bottom. Requires little maintenance.

Balsam Fir ○ ❖ ❖ M 60-75'

REMARKS: Longtime favorite as a Christmas tree from its distinctive aroma. Good songbird nesting area.

Colorado Blue Spruce ○ ☑ S 100'

REMARKS: Handsome ornamental specimen in single planting or dense, colorful screen, space 6' apart.

Fraser Fir ○ ❖ ❖ S 40-60'

REMARKS: An elegant conifer favored as a Christmas tree like Balsam. Grows better in this part of the state.

DECIDUOUS TREES & SHRUBS

American Cranberry ○ ◐ ❖ 8'

REMARKS: Excellent for screening (plant 2-3 ft. apart for solid screen). Snowy white flowers in spring, red berries in fall & winter. Berries make excellent bird feed. Have few insect problems.

Red Oak ○ ❖ ☼ F 60-75'

REMARKS: Hardy in zones 4-8. Exceptional shade trees, bear dark red fall foliage. Grow up to 2' per year, drought tolerant, easy to transplant.

Sargent Crabapple ○ ❖ ❖ S 6-10'

REMARKS: Attractive, compact landscape tree. Abundant clusters of white flowers in Spring following small berry-like fruit in fall to winter. Fruit attracts birds and provides good shelter.

Serviceberry ○ ◐ ❖ ❖ 6-15'

REMARKS: Excellent small yard tree. Provides year-round, ornamental interest. Produces short-lived white flowers followed by purple, edible fruit that taste like blueberries. Fruit attractive to birds, but also for jellies and baking. Produces 2-3 yrs after planting.

Silky Dogwood ■ ❖ M 6-10'

REMARKS: Large shrub with white flowers in mid-June to bluish colored fruit in Sept. Good for hedgerows.

SMALL FRUITS

Reka Blueberry ♠ ☑ F 4-6'

REMARKS: Hardy in zones 4-7. Yields 8-12 lbs. of medium-sized berries with good, sweet flavor.

Blueray Blueberry ○ ◐ ❖ ❖ ☑ 4-6'

REMARKS: Produces large, light blue, highly tart fruit. Outstanding dessert flavor. Ripens in early Aug. Self-fertile, but produces best crop when cross-pollinated.

REMARKS: Large, light-blue, firm, sweet w/ slight tartness fruit. Yields approx. 10-15 lbs/bush. Ripens late Jul/early Aug.

REMARKS: Virtually thornless, produces dark red, med-large, slightly tart berries in June & in fall. Perfect for jam or eating. Bears fruit in 2nd yr of growth.

REMARKS: Early season variety which is winter hardy. Produce bright red berries with wonderful flavor and aroma.

REMARKS: Highly productive, vigorous grower which can produce for up to 15 yrs. Highly disease-resistant.

REMARKS: Produces extremely large berries. Excellent flavor, big, sweet, firm, extra juicy June bearing. Produces fruit for 3-4 yrs.

REMARKS: Early season, winter hardy, produces good quality fruit. Best for fresh eating or freezing.

REMARKS: Exceptional, crisp, juicy apple that is a reliable annual bearer. Produces fruit in late-Sept. just before Red Delicious. Long storage life.

REMARKS: America's favorite snacking apple! Medium-sized, dark red apple that is crunchy, sweet and mild-flavored with strong shelf appeal. Excellent for snacking or in salads. Produces fruit in September just after Honeycrisp. Will produce fruit for 3-5 years.

REMARKS: Most popular of all peach varieties. Produces very large, juicy, deep, golden yellow with a blush of red fruit. Begins bearing large crops at 3-4 yrs, and reaches peak at 8-12 yrs. Ideal for eating, canning and freezing.

REMARKS: Excellent for eating, freezing or canning. Produces medium-large, heavy-bearing, almost fuzzless skin over firm, creamy yellow flesh fruit.

REMARKS: Produces large crops of sweet, firm, dark fruit measuring almost 1-in. wide. Bears fruit late; late June-early July. Self-fertile. Excellent for eating, drying, freezing, jam and sauce.
